looking for a more local viewpoint, take some free time to read the local newspaper (or the online version and all of its dreaded comments sections) and see what people in your community are interested in.

4. Search Engines. Sometimes finding the next trend to focus your marketing strategies on is simply a click away. By using search

terms like "Maine business trends" and "summer marketing ideas" I found a wealth of free resources useful to businesses of any type.






